Chairman Michael K. Brickey opened the meeting, gave the invocation, and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

On a motion by Stefanie C. Addington, duly seconded by L. Michele Glover, this board hereby amends the agenda by adding item 8b1 Thomas Village Community Center and moving item 13 to item 8c1 and 8c2.

Chairman Michael K. Brickey opened Citizen Expression Period to receive public comments.

Peggy Tyus spoke about Snowflake Road. She went on to say that there is nothing you can do with dirt roads but pave them. Delegate Terry Kilgore needs to get more funding, and she addressed moving funds for secondary roads. Ms. Tyus inquired about the Riverfront property losing money and Virginia Department of Transportation representatives attending another meeting. Ms. Tyus noted that she does not like the Six Year plan but would like for Snowflake Road to remain on the plan.

Kasey Fioramonti with the 4H program introduced two graduating seniors who have been involved with 4H and thanked the Board of Supervisors for their support.

Kent Stapleton and Sara Linkfire spoke about their experiences in 4H camp, serving as teen counselors, and travel opportunities. They spoke about the positive impact of the program and expressed appreciation for the support from the Board of Supervisors.

Hearing no further comments, Chairman Brickey closed Citizen Expression Period.

Jeff Arrington presented a VA250 Commission itemized budget and funding request to be considered during budget work sessions (Said presentation being attached to the minutes of this meeting (Minute Book 34 Attachment No: 52).

Mountain Empire Community College President, Dr. Kristen Westover and Dr. Amy Gear gave an update on the college and the Promise Program (Said update being attached to the minutes of this meeting; Minute Book 34 Attachment No: 53).

Chairman Michael Brickey inquired about the AIMS scholarship.

Dr. Westover replied that it is designed for a student to transfer from Mountain Empire Community College to UVA Wise tuition free.

Supervisor Maness questioned how the Board can advocate for that scholarship.

Dr. Gear replied that Mountain Empire Community College has advisors in high schools, but there needs to be more parent involvement.

Eric Smith and Doug Rasnic with Secor, LLC spoke about a Residential Reentry Program Business Plan and opioid funding request. Mr. Smith explained that the Department of Corrections closed Secor, Inc., and they are opening it back up. He went on to say that renovations are needed to open the facility that will assist people when they get out of prison to obtain a job, housing, transportation, and life skills. Doug Rasnic pointed out that the facility would serve Southwest Virginia. It was pointed out that each county is receiving opioid abatement funding, and they requested a portion of those funds to get the facility started back up. It was noted that Russell County is their fiscal agent, and Tazwell County has granted some funding. (Said presentation being attached to the minutes of this meeting; Minute Book 34 Attachment No: 54).

Pastor of Three Bells Methodist Church Sean Bailey and Jim Gates spoke about the activities at Thomas Village Community Center and renewing the lease.

On a motion by Christopher S. Maness, duly seconded by L. Michele Glover, this Board hereby approves the Thomas Village Community Center agreement with Three Bells Methodist Church (Said lease attached to the minutes of this meeting; Minute Book 34 Attachment No: 51).

Commissioner of the Revenue Tammy Tiller spoke about a real estate software program that is needed with the Munis Software. Ms. Tiller went on to say that she did not know software for real estate would be needed with the new Munis program and thought it would be merged into the Munis system instead. Ms. Tiller obtained quotes for the software and recommended ConciseCAMA.

On a motion by L. Michele Glover, duly seconded by Stefanie C. Addington, this Board hereby approves the purchase of ConciseCAMA real estate software for the Commissioner of the Revenue to use in conjunction with the Munis Software system. The first payment of \$20,904.81 will be from Board Contingency and remaining \$118,460 will be in the FY25 budget.

Ellen Bailey, Carolyn Bailey, and Diana Bailey spoke about property they own in Gate City. They reported on their rental property that the Town of Gate City demolished without properly notifying them first. In addition, they pointed out that the Town of Gate City requested payment from them in the amount of \$21,000 for the demo. The Bailey family went on to say that they remedied a problem by removing weeds at this property in August, and that cost \$250. In February 2024, the property was torn down. If payment for the demolition is not paid, the property will go to auction. The Baileys noted that other homes in the area are far worse than their property.

Chairman Michael Brickey advised that situation is a town issue.

The Board suggested that they speak to a lawyer.

The Baileys indicated that would be too expensive.

Supervisor Stefanie Addington stated that the Board of Supervisors do not have jurisdiction in the Town of Gate City.

Supervisor L. Michele Glover suggested that they speak with Mayor Jamie Lawson.

County Attorney Sally Kegley recommended Legal Aid.

County Administrator Freda Starnes provided a phone number for Legal Aid. In addition, it was pointed out that the Gate City Town Council meeting is next Tuesday at 6:00 p.m.

The Bailey family noted that the Board of Supervisors assisted them in getting a tree cut that was in the power line and going to fall on their home; however, they did not finish the job by taking away the logs and branches.

Bill Dingus noted that the hazard was mitigated, and he offered to follow-up about the branches.

Animal Control Officer Jake Dougherty reported that he has been a member of the Upper Tennessee River Roundtable representing Scott County for 12 years. He reported that the group focuses on improving water quality and receives funds through grants, fundraisers, and dues. He went on to say that there is one employee that is the backbone of the organization, and there is funding that pays a portion of their salary. Mr. Dougherty requested funding to assist with compensating this employee.

Animal Control Officer Jake Dougherty proposed an amendment to the Animal Control Ordinance that would prohibit at-large dogs and packs of dogs.

Public Works Director Bill Dingus spoke about Litter Awareness Month. He went on to say that every April litter awareness is ramped up through school programs, flyers, social media, and billboards. Our efforts are to encourage everyone to work together to make our county a beautiful place to live. Mr. Dingus mentioned a program through Virginia Department of Transportation. A business adopts a highway and makes a donation for Virginia Department of Transportation to hire a contractor to pick up litter on that section of road. Signs are placed showing the business supports that section of road.

Mr. Dingus reported that the Solid Waste Committee met several times. The committee looked at the tipping and transportation contract renewal with Waste Management that will be due May 7th. The renewal has to mutually be agreed upon for the next five years. Their renewal is based on the Composite Price Index for that industry. This year they proposed an increase from \$24.94 to \$30.70 per ton for disposal and \$13.04 to 17.70 per ton for transportation. He reported that every county is running into that kind of increase. An RFP could be sent; however, it would be bid based on market, and market is a lot higher than this. Mr. Dingus reported that Supervisor Danny Casteel and Michele Glover were great members on the Solid Waste Committee. The committee recommended that we renew for the next five years. It does not require any action from the Board of Supervisors. The dynamics of the area is changing. Sullivan County is building a recycling facility that will hopefully bring back recycling to Scott County. The committee recommended that the Board of Supervisors have discussion about the tipping fee at the Transfer Station to address the deficit. It would cost \$47.14 per ton to haul to Blountville. There have been a number of contractors claiming waste disposal on behalf of property owners involving structural waste that incurs no tipping fee. Currently, the Solid Waste Ordinance allows those owning property in Scott County to dispose of their waste at no fee. Commercial, industrial, and structural waste is charged. A recommendation by the Solid Waste Committee is for all structural waste to be charged a tipping fee making it easier to distinguish at the transfer station. That is a discussion for the Board and can be done by resolution instead of changing the ordinance.

Supervisor Michele Glover pointed out that the tipping fee has not been raised in forever, and it is time to raise that fee. She proposed \$55. The cost to the county is \$47.14. We are the lowest of the surrounding counties.

Supervisor Stefanie Addington inquired about the method of payment.

Mr. Dingus replied that contractors have accounts and are billed. Others pay by cash or check.

Supervisor Darrel Jeter asked how this would be controlled since they could put it in dumpsters instead of taking it to the Transfer Station.

Supervisor Michele Glove replied that the gates need to be closed every night at 8:00 p.m.

Mr. Dingus replied that someone would need to be there to close and open.

Supervisor Glover pointed out that it would prevent people from coming in when no one is there and dumping things that they should not be dumping if they are closed at night.

Mr. Dingus replied that would require the attendant to go to work twice.

Supervisor Jeter noted that the blue dumpsters at Yuma are always full.

Supervisor Michele Glover suggested using cameras.

Mr. Dingus replied that additional signage that states no structural debris could be installed. It is tough catching them even with cameras.

Supervisor Danny Casteel stated that the only way to control it is to have cameras, someone watching at all times, and a loud speaker.

Supervisor Eddie Skeen agreed that would be a solution.

Mr. Dingus added that it is difficult to read license plates at any time of day. It comes back to the issue of the sites not being manned all the time, and it is expensive to man them all the time. Mr. Dingus pointed out that the sites are open 133 hours per week, and there is someone there 24 hours.

Supervisor Glover reported that the committee did discuss opening and closing daily.

Supervisor Addington inquired about the S.C.O.T.T. Service workers being used at the sites.

Mr. Dingus replied that none are currently being used. In the past, there was one that was good. It has to be the right person.

County Administrator Freda Starnes explained that there is the potential for drug trade; therefore, it has to be the right person.

Supervisor Chris Maness pointed out that people may burn their structural waste to avoid tipping fees, and he pondered the affects that could come from that.

Mr. Dingus noted that structural waste can be dumped on the floor at the transfer station. That is easier to unload.

Supervisor Stefanie Addington pointed out that setting the tipping fee at \$60 would take care of it for a while.

Mr. Dingus requested that the Board think about this. A decision does not need to be made until May 7th

Supervisor Darrel Jeter commented that people will not take it to the transfer station if it is set too high.

Mr. Dingus addressed the possibility of compactors in the future. He went on to say that packer trucks can hold 20 dumpsters; therefore, adding more dumpsters at the sites will not solve anything.

Supervisor Stefanie Addington inquired about partnering with Eastman's Methanolysis Plant.

Mr. Dingus stated that he has been working with Eastman, but they require it to be bailed. A middle man is needed such as the facility Sullivan County is developing.

It was the consensus of the Board that County Attorney Sally Kegley draft a resolution with a blank amount for consideration at the May 7th meeting. (Said Solid Waste Committee recommendations attached to the minutes of this meeting; Minute Book 34 Attachment No: 57).

FAIR HOUSING
RESOLUTION 2024 - 02

BE it known by all persons, that the following resolution of the Scott County Board of Supervisors, endorsing the concept of FAIR HOUSING, was duly adopted and approved on April 2, 2024:

WHEREAS, the Scott County Board of Supervisors endeavors to ensure equal opportunity for all persons residing in Scott County to live in decent housing facilities; and

WHEREAS, discrimination in the sale, purchase, rental, or financing of housing against any person based on race, color, religion, national origin, sex, age, familial status, disability, veteran status, gender identity, sexual orientation, or source of funds will be prohibited by Scott County; and

WHEREAS, the Scott County Board of Supervisors does hereby designate Ms. Freda R. Starnes, County Administrator of Scott County, as the Fair Housing Administrator to investigate all complaints of Fair Housing discrimination; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Freda R. Starnes in her official capacity as Fair Housing Administrator will work with the Board of Supervisors to make themselves aware of these provisions of Fair Housing in Scott County; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Supervisors of Scott County, Virginia, endorses the concept of Fair Housing within Scott County and that Ms. Freda R. Starnes as the designated Fair Housing Administrator is hereby authorized to further Scott County’s efforts in this regard.

There was discussion among the Board about raising fees at the Golf Course.

Supervisor Eddie Skeen noted that Appalachian Harvest would like to do a presentation at the May meeting, and they have invited the Board of Supervisors to tour their facility following the meeting. He noted revenue sharing from the Bristol Casino and Project Intersection. Supervisor Skeen pointed out that the Department of Housing and Community Development proposes to fund a project in Dungannon and will hold a meeting on April 18, 2024 at the Dungannon Town Hall. He went on to say that there will be a Public Service Authority meeting at Midway Methodist Church on April 18, 2024. Supervisor Skeen reported that Appalachian Community Action and Development Agency offers free tax preparation services. He also reported that he and Superintendent of Schools John Ferguson discussed the road survey.

Supervisor Darrel Jeter inquired about the camera being fixed at the Yuma site.

Mr. Dingus replied that one is on order, it was not fixed as of Friday, but he would look into that.

Chairman Brickey asked everyone to remember the family of James Ward.

Supervisor Eddie Skeen reported that he did not receive any calls this month regarding the Virginia Department of Transportation. He did contact six residents that had outstanding work orders, and they reported that everything is being addressed. The asphalt plants are closed; therefore, any paving that is needed will begin when they reopen. Ditch and drain pipe repairs have been done in Nickelsville. Orange bags on Routes 71, 72, and Fairview have been picked up. Supervisor Skeen reported that the Natural Tunnel Highway Safety Smart Scale Project is on the schedule for funding. He addressed Gate Road, Dean Hollow Road, and stated that Smart Scale Projects get ranked and completed based on priority. Supervisor Skeen discussed surveys submitted by seven school bus drivers for 13 locations. They reported a lot of pot holes. Rainbow Rock Lane is under environmental review, River Bluff Road rock slide repair is scheduled, tree limbs to be trimmed, Yuma Road sign replacement requested, and Little Duck Road vegetation scheduled. Supervisor Skeen reported that there were six surveys submitted by the Sheriff's office with fourteen incidents. Pot holes Hanging Rock to Coeburn, guard rail needs, center lines painted on a portion of Big Moccasin, Wade Meadows and Ponderosa bridge related items handled by the bridge crew in Jonesville, Copper Creek rescheduled, Ben Bolt Drive gravel section not maintained by Virginia Department of Transportation, and Double Ford Road not accessible due to high water. Supervisor Skeen pointed out that Allan Sumpter has been good to work with, and Virginia Department of Transportation has been getting items done. He went on to say the Virginia Department of Transportation meeting with Delegate Kilgore and Senator Pillion has been delayed due to the Budget in Richmond, and Duane Miller would like to be included in that meeting.

County Administrator Freda Starnes advised that she has only done the preapplication for the Natural Tunnel Smart Scale Project. It has not been funded yet. The Virginia Department of Transportation reviews it, then scores it.

Supervisor Chris Maness pointed out that several wrecks have occurred there.
